After years of effort lead by Tammy Nosek of the ASCE Mid-Hudson Branch, Jennifer Turner is now the proud owner of a handicap-accessible home in Auburn, Maine!

On June 24, 2011, a ribbon cutting ceremony was held at the newly finished house. The event was attended by local government officials, volunteers from various stages of the project, members of the media, as well as curious neighbors. Attendees got to see state-of-the art technology first hand, from push button appliances to a lift system that allows Jennifer to move by herself from her bedroom to her living room and her bathroom.
